



## **State Funded Teacher Firearm Training Curriculum**

40-hours minimum

(1) hour of general firearm safety to include safe handling of firearms, safe carrying of firearms and safe storage of firearms.

(1/2) hour of general care of firearms and basic firearm cleaning, oiling, preventative maintenance and repair.

(24) hours of basic marksmanship training that includes annual completion of the HST Handgun Qualification Course and scenario-based training.

(8) hours of dynamic shooting drills that include:

- Shooting in high-stress environments.
- Shooting in highly populated environments.
- Shooting while moving and communicating with third parties.
- Shooting at multiple targets.
- Shooting while moving to and from cover.

(1) hour of firearms retention training that includes:

- Retention of a handgun while holstered.
- Retention of a handgun while drawn.
- Retention of shotguns and rifles.
- Responses to common handgun, shotgun and rifle disarming techniques.

(2) hours of tactical movement and maneuvering while armed to include presentation and manipulation of a firearm while moving in hallways, at room entrances, in open spaces and venues and in restricted spaces and areas.

(1) hour of training on the legal consequences of a use of force action.



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Continued

(1) hour discussion of post-shooting considerations and consequences consisting of the following topics:

- Psychological and emotional responses following a shooting or use of force action.
- The proper securing of a weapon following a shooting.
- The preservation of evidence following a shooting or use of force action.
- Safely identifying oneself to a law enforcement officer while armed or immediately following a use of force action.

(1) hour review of prior school shootings and active shooter incidents to evaluate and analyze past school shootings and active shooter incidents for the purpose of illustrating concepts discussed during the safety and training course and critiquing ineffective or dangerous responses made by other individuals during the course of a school shooting or active shooter incident.

(1) hour training on tactical emergency medical care skills

Any other topic or remedial training deemed appropriate or necessary by the course instructor or necessitated by circumstances or conditions unique to a specific school, teacher or student.
